MSRUAS has implemented a structured and comprehensive career guidance program for students. Career Counselling initiatives have been designed to provide students regarding career options. At MSRUAS, Alumni Guidance and Psychometric Assessments have been successful in helping students to determine the best suited career path for a student based on their passions, interests and personality. The first step taken was self-assessment, which helped in identifying his/her aptitude, interest and personality. Subsequently the students went through career assessment tests which acted as tools of self-exploration, awareness and the fundamental point of reference for career counselling. In the academic year 2018-19, regular offline career counselling was conducted. In view of the COVID pandemic, online career counselling sessions were conducted in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Career Guidance Programs are domain specific and included professional workshops and activities. These programmes were conducted by the Faculty of Management and Commerce, Faculty of Life and Allied Health Sciences, Faculty of Dental Sciences, Faculty of Hospitality Management and Catering Technology, Faculty of Pharmacy, Faculty of Engineering

and Technology, Faculty of Art and Design and Faculty of Mathematical and Physical Sciences.

At MSRUIAS, career counselling is carried out in a systematic manner as illustrated. Online sessions were conducted in 2019-20 and 2020-21.

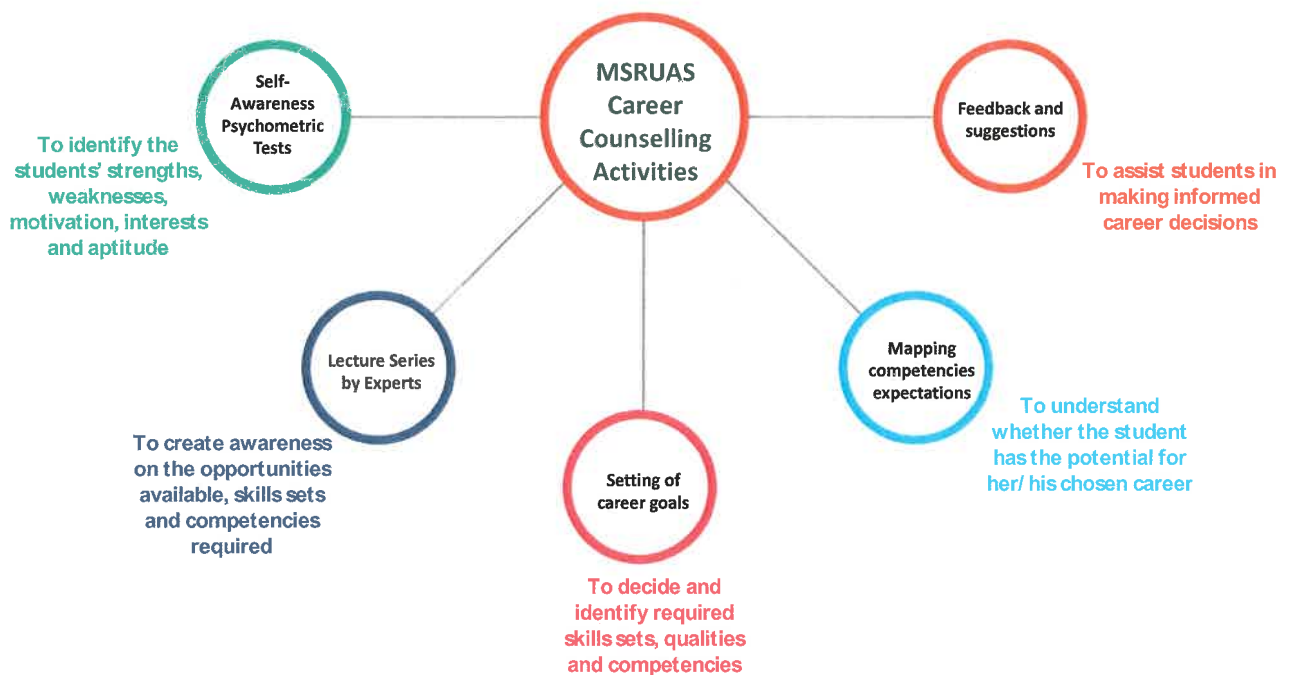
Self-Awareness activities and Psychometric Tests - conducted to identify the students' strengths, weaknesses, motivation, interests and aptitude.

Lecture Series -industry experts, academicians from reputed organizations, counsellors for higher education, researchers, representatives from Government . departments, successful entrepreneurs and alumni, create awareness on the opportunities available, skills sets and competencies required.

Setting career goals - The Directorate of Training and Placement and faculty members help students to choose career paths for themselves (higher education/ employment/entrepreneurship). They are assisted in identifying skills sets, qualities and competencies required to achieve their career goals.

Mapping their strengths, competencies, interests and aptitude against the expectations- This helps them to understand whether the student has the potential for his chosen career, identify the students' weaknesses and to identify areas that require improvement.

Feedback and suggestions- Based on the mapping, the faculty members provide the students with This helps students in making informed career decisions. They connect the students with mentors who could assist them in improving their skill sets, advise them to achieve higher grades, gain industry exposure / intern in related areas, gain additional certifications and develop a strong professional network.



Coaching classes have been conducted for NET, NEET, GPAT, PG CET, JAM, CSIR, GRE, GATE and Bank exams in Faculty of Mathematical and Physical Sciences, Faculty of Engineering and Technology, Faculty of Life and Allied Health Sciences and Faculty of Dental Sciences. 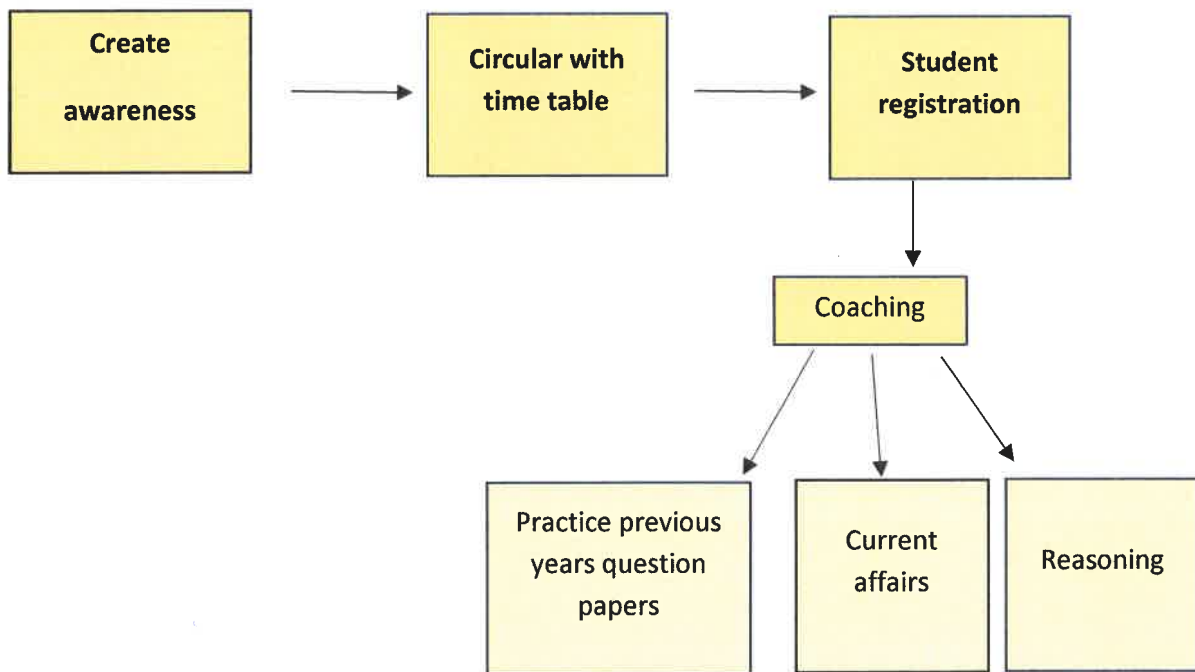


Fig: Guidance for competitive examinations
